

Precision Machining Training Program Summer 2022

Stop looking for that next job... Start building your new career! The Precision Machining Training Program is an 8-week hands-on program that provides students with the skills needed to fill high-demand machining positions for Lehigh Valley and Pocono businesses. Participants will gain foundational skills in manufacturing including safety; reading blue prints; shop math; measurement and the use of calipers and Vernier scales; and operating lathes and milling machines. An introduction to CNC (computer numerical control) machining is also covered.

This non-credit, grant funded program, is **free** to qualified candidates and prepares students for a career in Precision Machining while also earning National Institute of Metalworking Skills (NIMS) industry-recognized credentials. Occupational skill building and workplace employability skills are also included in the curriculum.
